and tactics know that infantry is the Queen of Battles, since only infantrymen can take or hold ground. Not so well-known to the general public is the other half of the adage: artillery is the King of the battlefield, because artillery provides the fire support that allows infantry to take or hold ground. The Second World War showed that a field army's ability to bring artillery fire to bear quickly to mass fire is a solid indicator of that army's ability to achieve its objectives. The three keys to artillery success are appropriate weapons, a system for controlling their fire, and personnel to use the system and the materiel to accomplish a given mission. *Able on the Way!* lets the reader experience all three of these dimensions, as well as the life and labors of the infantrymen supported by the firepower of the artillery. S. Army field artillerymen and the infantrymen they support in combat.
